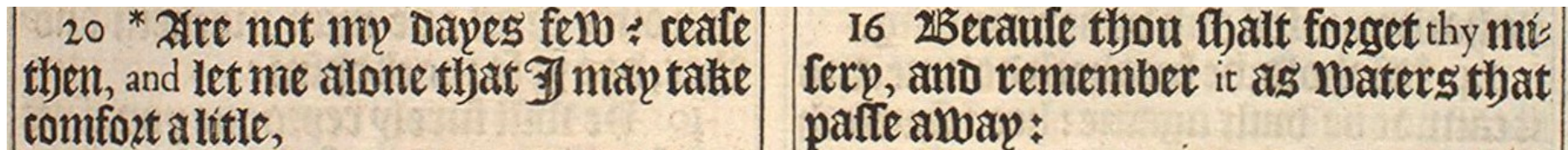


# A word-search puzzle from the Bible Pages. Theme: The 1611 King James version.

This is an eight-page version for larger text on A4-printers. For the same puzzle in normal layout, see this address:

65 words are hidden in this puzzle. They are printed across, or up or down, or diagonally, backwards or forwards, but always in a straight line, with no letters skipped. Each letter may form a part of more than one word. All letters do not belong to words, and there is no “hidden message”. This is a hard puzzle, with archaic words from KJV-1611. Here is an image of Job 10:20 and 11:16 in the first edition of king James’ bible, showing how its text looked like:

Asswaged	God made a winde to passe ouer the earth, and the waters asswaged – Genesis 8:1	Subsided, went down, sank
Baulme	A company of Ishmeelites came from Gilead, with their camels, bearing spicery, & baulme, and myrrhe – Genesis 37:25	Balm, perfumes

Perfite	Thou shalt bee perfite with the Lord thy God – Deuteronomy 18:13	Complete, whole, blameless, sincere (“perfect”)

Vndersettters	And euery base had foure brasen wheeles, and plates of brasse: and the foure corners therof had vndersettters: vnder the lauer were vndersettters molten, at the side of euery addition – 1 Kings 7:30	Undersetter = support, prop
Vniust	O deliuer me from the deceitfull and vniust man – Psalms 43:1	Vniust = unjust
Wimples	The changeable suits of apparel, and the mantles, and the wimples, and the crisping pins – Isaiah 3:22	Cloaks or shawls or mantles or something similar
Wist	They said one to another, It is Manna: for they wist not what it was – Exodus 16:15	Wist = knew (wit, wist, witting, wot)
